STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Permit Before Examination for Applicant to Practice Barbering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 224 of Chapter 25 as amended is further amended by adding a new paragraph as follows:

'If any applicant to practice barbering, who has been a resident of the State of Maine for a period of at least 6 months, qualifies for examination, the board may issue to such applicant, until the results of the applicant's examination have been given, a permit to practice barbering under supervision of a person registered to practice barbering. Permit shall terminate with examination following applicant's qualification. No permit shall be renewable. Such applicant shall be considered an apprentice. The applicant shall pay to the board a fee of \$3.'.
