STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Richardson Lakes, Upper and Lower, and Their Tributaries, Oxford County.

Richardson Lakes, Upper and Lower and Tributaries, regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a 5 fish limit in the aggregate from the waters of Richardson Lakes, Upper and Lower, and their tributaries and Rapid River and Pond-in-the-River, all in Oxford County, and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait in these waters.

Fly fishing only, in that part of Richardson Lake from the mouth of Metallak Brook to a straight line drawn between 3 red posts, one set on the east shore of Pine Island, one on the mainland in a southerly direction from Pine Island and one on the mainland in a northeasterly direction from Pine Island. The above described area shall be closed I hour after sunset to I hour before sunrise of the following morning, except to the taking of smelts.

Fly fishing only, in that part of Richardson Lake from the mouth of Mosquito Brook to a straight line drawn between a red post set on the south shore of Mosquito Brook Cove approximately 300 feet from the mouth of said brook and a red post set on the north shore of said cove. The above described area shall be closed I hour after sunset to I hour before sunrise of the following morning, except to the taking of smelts.

Upper Dam Pool shall be defined as being that area between the dam at the outlet of Mooselookmeguntic Lake and a line drawn between the two rocks and cribwork piers approximately 800 yards west of the aforesaid dam and only fly fishing shall be permitted. Daily bag limit of I fish per person from September 15 to September 30.

Metallak Brook and its tributaries shall be closed to all fishing except to the taking of smelts.

Rapid River and Pond-in-the-River shall be fly fishing only. From September 16 to September 30, both Rapid River and Pond-in-the-River shall be open to fishing with a daily bag limit of one fish from either or both of these bodies of water; and be it further

Resolved: That any regulations inconsistent with this regulation be, and hereby are, repealed.
