## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 99th LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to S. P. 472, L. D. 1337, Bill, "An Act Establishing a Minimum Wage."

Amend said Bill by striking out paragraphs C, D and E subsection III of section 132-B and inserting in place thereof the following:

- 'C. Any individual employed as an outside salesman on a commission basis, whose working time and mode of operation are not in any material manner regulated or prescribed by the employer;
- D. Any individual engaged in the activities of a publicsupported nonprofit organization or in a program controlled by an educational nonprofit organization;
- E. Any individual employed as a counselor or junior counselor by a summer camp for boys or girls under the age of 19 years;

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of subsection V of section 132-B and inserting in place thereof the following:

'V. "Wages" paid to any employee includes compensation paid to such employee in the form of legal tender of the United States, checks on banks convertible into cash on demand, and also includes the reasonable cost, which shall be consistent with rules and regulations as set forth by the Employment Security Commission, to the employer of furnishing such employee with board, lodging or other facilities if such board, lodging or other facilities are furnished by such employer to his employee and used by such employee. In any occupation in which gratuities have customarily and usually constituted and have been recognized as part of the remuneration for hiring purposes, wages shall also include an allowance for such gratuities in an amount not to exceed 30¢ per hour, provided the employee received in gratuities the amount claimed, and the commissioner may require each employer desiring an allowance for gratuities to provide substantial evidence that the amount claimed was received by the employee.

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "Sec. 132-C." by striking out the underlined figures "\$.80" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '\$1'
