SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said Corporation, shall be holden at such time and place. and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

SECT. 3. Bc it further enacted, That the powers granted Legislature may by this act, may be enlarged, restrained or repealed, at the this act. pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER VII.

AN ACT to modify and limit the terms and conditions of the Act for Separation relative to Bowdoin College and encourage Literature and the Arts and Sciences.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That provided the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall agree thereto, the Terms of act of President and Trustees and the Overseers of Bowdoin College, separation conhaving already assented thereto, the terms and conditions nulled. mentioned in the Act of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts passed on the nineteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, entitled "An Act relating to the Separation of the District of Maine from Massachusetts proper and forming the same into a separate and Independent State," be and they hereby are so far modified, limited or annulled, as that the said President and Trustees, Powers of the and the Overseers of Bowdoin College shall have, hold and altered by the lo-gislature. enjoy their powers and privileges in all respects, subject, however, to be altered, limited, restrained or extended by the Legislature of the State of Maine, as shall by said Legislature be judged necessary to promote the best interests of said institution.
