## CHAPTER VII.

Governor's Message relative to Books and Maps received from Massachusetts.

*To the Senate and House of Representatives,*

The Secretary will lay before you a Schedule of the Books, Maps and Public Documents received from the Secretary's office of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, being Maine's proportion of all the Laws, Resolves and other Documents remaining in the Secretary's office, 31st May 1820. The Books and Maps, the property of towns and individuals of this State, have not been forwarded; as there would be a convenience in having them distributed from this place, I suggest the propriety therefore of your adopting such measures as will place them in the Secretary's office here for that purpose.

*Ordered,* That the Secretary of State cause the books and maps referred to in the Governor's communication to be deposited in the Secretary's office, there to remain subject to the order of the Legislature.

*Ordered,* That the Secretary be directed to apply to, and receive from, the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, all such books and maps as remain in his office, belonging to towns, plantations and individuals in the State of Maine; and when so received, he is directed to deliver out all such books and maps to such towns, plantations, and individuals as are entitled to receive the same, when called for, they receipting therefor; and he is further

*Ordered,* to cause so much of the Schedule accompanying the Governor's communication as refers to towns, plantations and individuals, to be published in the public newspapers printed in Portland, giving notice of the place where they may be called for.

## CHAPTER VIII.

Resolve authorizing the Treasurer to receive \$3000 of the Treasurer of Massachusetts, and to receive the tax of the Banks. *June 13th, 1820.*

*Resolved,* That the Treasurer of this State be, and he hereby is authorized to receive of the Treasurer of the Commonwealth of
