CHAPTER XVIII.

AN ACT to incorporate the Master, Wardens and Members of Kennebec Lodge.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of SECT. 1. Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Ebenezer T. Persons incor. Warren, Jesse Robinson, Gideon Farrell, Ezekiel Goodale, porated. Samuel G. Ladd, Amos Nourse, Ebenezer White, Ariel Mann, Moses Whittier, Beriah Mann, Calvin Spaulding, Samuel K. Gilman, John P. Flagg, Samuel Nelson, William C. Lord, Joshua O'Le Fevre, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Master, Wardens and Members of Kennebec Lodge ; with power to sue and be sued ; to have a common seal, and to change the same ; to make any bye-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold, for charitable and benev- May hold 10,000 olent uses, any real estate to the value of ten thousand dollars, dollars real, and any personal estate to the value of thirty thousand dollars; And 80,000 doland to give and grant, or bargain, and sell the same : and lars personal estate. with all the privileges usually granted to other Societies, instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting First meeting. of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers granted Act may be al-by this Act, may be enlarged, restrained or repealed, at the ed. pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER XIX.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of Portsmouth Bridge.

WHEREAS the State of New-Hampshire, by an Act of Preamble. the Legislature of the same, passed on the twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Proprietors of Portsmouth Bridge," did make and constitute Jeremiah Mason, Edward Cutts, and others, their associates, a body politic and corporate for the purpose of building a bridge over the Piscataqua river; And, whereas the Commonwealth of Massa-
