CHAPTER XXXVI.

AN ACT to establish the town lines of the town of Unity.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the town lines of the town of Unity, shall be as follows: beginning at the north west corner of the Waldo patent; thence running west north west five and a half miles; thence south south west, about six miles to the town of Fairfax; thence east south east to the west line of the Waldo patent; thence northerly on said patent line to the first mentioned bounds.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That so much of the act Act repealed. entitled An Act, to incorporate the plantation called twenty-five mile pond, in the county of Kennebec, into a town by the name of Unity as is contrary to the provisions of this act, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

AN ACT to incorporate the Master, Wardens and Members of Rising Virtue Lodge.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Joseph R. Persons incorporated. Lumbert, Davis J. Bent, Francis Carr, Alexander Savage, Abner Taylor, Joshua Wingate Carr, Jacob M'Gaw, Mark Trafton, Ebenezer Weston and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic by the name of the Master, Wardens and Members of Rising Virtue Lodge; with power to sue and be sued, to have a common seal and to change the same; to make any bye-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold May hold 10,000 dollars real estate, for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate to the value of ten thousand dollars and any personal estate to the value and 30,000 dollars personal estate. of thirty thousand dollars, and to give and grant, or bargain and sell the same; and with all the privileges usually granted to other societies, instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting First meeting. of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as a majority of the persons herein named may direct.
