SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That all vacancies which to the charter at annual meeting corporation of overseers, shall be filled in manner prescribed

CHAPTER LXXX.

AN ACT to prevent the obstruction of Narraguagus River.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives

Penalty for obstructing the river,

in Legislature assembled, That if any person or persons shall throw any slabs, stumps, trees or brush into the Narraguagus River, whereby said River may be obstructed to the injury of any citizens of this State, he or they shall forfeit and pay for each offence, a sum not exceeding fifteen dollars, nor less than five dollars, to any person who will sue for the same, and also shall be liable to pay all damages which any individual may suffer by reason of such obstructions, in an action of the case, in any Court proper to try the same.
