JANUARY SESSION, 1821.

CHAPTER I.

Resolve confirming the doings of the Town of Greenwood. January 17, 1821.

On the petition of the Selectmen of the town of Greenwood, stating that at the meeting of the inhabitants of said town, in March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, certain defects and errors existed in choosing a Collector, and Surveyor of lumber, the record of whose choice was made by a Town Clerk not sworn into office according to law:

Resolved, That, for reasons set forth in said petition, the proceedings of said town, in the choice of said Collector and Surveyor of lumber, be, and they hereby are confirmed and made valid in law; any of the errors and defects aforesaid notwithstanding.

CHAPTER II.

Resolve fixing the times to which the salaries of all Officers shall be made up and paid. January 18, 1821.

Resolved, That the salary of the Reporter of the decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court, required to be paid from the Treasury of the State, shall be paid in quarterly payments.

Resolved, That the salaries of all officers in this State, which by law are, or hereafter may be, made payable quarterly at the Treasury, shall be made up to the last days in December, March, June and September, inclusively, in each year; and paid accordingly on warrant drawn by the Governor, pursuant to law.
