CHAPTER XVII.

Resolve authorizing the Selectmen of the town of Fryeburg, to remove the Gun-House, in said town. *February 27, 1821.*

Resolved, That the Selectmen of the town of Fryeburg, be authorized to cause to be removed the Gun House, Cannon and Carriages, the property of this State, in the town of Fryeburg, to a more safe and convenient place in said town; and they are hereby authorised to sell in behalf of the State, the land, on which said Gun House now stands, and to execute a deed of the same; and to purchase land on which to remove said Gun House, and take a deed of the same in behalf of the State: *Provided,* That such purchase and removal shall be made without expense to the State.

CHAPTER XVIII.

Resolve confirming the doings of certain Justices of the Peace, who were Trustees of Bridgton Academy. *February 28, 1821.*

ON the Petition of the Trustees of Bridgton Academy, praying a confirmation of the doings of certain Justices of the Peace:

Resolved, For the reasons set forth in their petition, that all acknowledgments of deeds executed by, and to, the Trustees of said Academy, taken by Justices of the Peace, who were at such time Trustees of said Academy, shall be, and the same are hereby confirmed, and rendered valid in law, in every respect, as if the same had been taken by any Justice of the Peace, not a Trustee of said Corporation.

CHAPTER XIX.

Resolve authorizing the Secretary of State to purchase three copies of Mellish's Map. *February 28, 1821.*

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be directed to subscribe for, and procure for the use of the State, three Copies of Mellish's Map and Statistical View of the United States; and the Governor is requested to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of this State, to defray the expense thereof: *Provided,* The same shall not exceed the sum of thirty dollars.
