berland shall form one District, and choose three Senators ; the county of Lincoln shall form one District, and choose four Senators ; the county of Kennebec shall form one District, and choose three Senators ; the county of Hancock shall form one District, and choose two Senators ; the county of Oxford shall form one District, and choose two Senators ; the county of Somerset shall form one District, and choose one Senator ; the county of Penobscot shall form one District, and choose one Senator ; the county of Washington shall form one District, and choose one Senator.

CHAPTER LXXI.

Resolve making an appropriation for the payment of the Board of Commissioners, appointed under the Act of Separation. *March 21, 1821.*

WHEREAS it is provided by the Act of Separation, which passed June 19th, 1819, that a board of commissioners shall be appointed for the purposes mentioned in said Act ; the expense of which to be paid equally by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the State of Maine : And whereas said board of commissioners have been duly appointed :

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is appropriated, one thousand dollars, for the payment of one half of the expense of said board of commissioners, appointed as aforesaid, to the time of passing this Resolve. And the Governor of this State is hereby authorized and empowered, on the part of this State, to allow to the several members of said board of commissioners, on the part of this State, to be by them accounted for, the sum of four dollars for each day, that they have been employed under said commission, and to allow the same travel to each member from his place of residence, to the State House in Boston, at their different meetings, as is allowed to members of the Legislature of this State, or the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. And the Governor, with advice of Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to draw his warrant on the Treasury for such sum, not exceeding one thousand dollars, as shall be found due to the said commissioners, on the part of this State, according to the terms aforesaid.

CHAPTER LXXII.

Resolve granting a sum of money to Josiah Dunn, jr. and Isreal Waterhouse. *March 21, 1821.*

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, the sum of five dollars to Josiah Dunn, jr. and Israel Waterhouse, each, in

full for travelling from Portland to Saco, to obtain information from the Marshal of this District, relative to the census of this District. And that the Governor, with advice and consent of the Council, be requested to draw his warrant on the Treasury accordingly.

CHAPTER LXXIII.

Resolve on the Pay Roll of the Senate. *March 22, 1821.*

THE Pay Roll of the Senate of the State of Maine, for the second Session of the first Legislature, held in Portland, which commenced on the tenth day of January, and closed on the twenty second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, for their travel and attendance.
