CHAPTER LXXVI.

Resolve appointing a Committee to examine certain accounts, and to report the same to the Governor and Council. *March 22, 1821.*

Resolved, That Messrs. Bixby, of Cornville, Irish, of Gorham, and Vose, of Augusta, be a committee to examine the several accounts of sheriffs and coroners, the miscellaneous accounts, and the pauper accounts, as reported by the joint standing committee on accounts, and allowed by this Legislature, with leave to report on the same to the Governor and Council; and the Governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of this State, for the payment of such part of said accounts only, as said Committee shall report to be justly due and ought now to be paid; and the remainder of such accounts shall be referred to the first session of the next Legislature for their consideration: *Provided,* That said committee shall not be allowed to hold their session longer than five days next after the adjournment of this Legislature.

CHAPTER LXXVII.

Resolve apportioning the Representatives on the several Counties, Towns, Plantations and Classes, on the first apportionment. *March 22, 1821.*

Resolved, That the county of York shall choose twenty three Representatives, apportioned in the following manner: viz. The town of York, one; Kittery, one; Elliot, one; South Berwick, one; Berwick, one; Saco, one; Hollis, one; Biddeford, one; Kennebunk Port, one; Kennebunk, one; Wells, one; Limington, one; Buxton, one; Lyman, one; Sanford, one; Alfred, one; Shapleigh, one; Limerick, one; Parsonsfield, one; Waterborough, one; Newfield, one; Cornish, one; Lebanon, one:—County of Cumberland shall choose twenty five Representatives: viz. Portland, three; Brunswick, one; Durham, one; Freeport, one; North Yarmouth, one; Cumberland, one; Falmouth, one; Scarborough, one; Westbrook, one; Standish, one; Gorham, one; Windham, one; New-Gloucester, one; Minot, one; Harpswell, one; Poland, one; Gray, one; Raymond and Thompson Pond [Plantation] one; Bridgton, one; Baldwin, one; Cape-Elizabeth, one; Otisfield and Harrison, one; Danville and Pownal, one, to send alternately, Danville first:—The County of Lincoln shall have twenty six Representatives: viz. The town of Bath, one; Bowdoin, one; Bowdoinham, one; Litchfield, one; Lisbon, one; Wiscasset, one; Edgcomb, one; Jefferson, one; Nobleborough, one; Boothbay, one; Warren, one; Thomaston, one; Camden, one; Waldoborough, one; Bristol, one; Topsham, one; Whitefield, one; Lewiston, one, for the years 1822, 1824 and 1826; and Wales, one, for 1823 and 1825; Georgetown, one, for 1822, 1824, and 1826; and

Phipsburg, one, for 1823 and 1825 ; Woolwich, one, for 1822, 1824 and 1826 ; and Friendship, one, for 1823 and 1825 ; New-Castle and Alna, one ; St. George and Cushing, one ; Union and Putnam, one ; Hope and Appleton, one ; Montville and Montville Plantation, one ; Dresden, one, for the years 1822, 1824 and 1826 ; and Palermo, one, for the years 1823 and 1825 :—County of Hancock shall have sixteen Representatives : viz. Belfast, one ; Frankfort, one ; Prospect, one ; Northport and Islesborough, one ; Lincolnville and Searsmont, one ; Belmont, Waldo, Knox, and Swanville, one ; Brooks, Thordike, Jackson and Monroe, one ; Castine and Brooksville, one ; Deer-Isle, one ; Bluehill and Sedgwick, one ; Surry, Ellsworth, Trenton, Mariaville and Plantation No. 14, one ; Vinalhaven, Butter Island, Eagle Island, Great Spruce Head Beach Island, Hog Island, Marshal's Island, Placentia Island, Black Island, Mark Island, Burnt Coat Island, Long Island, and Pond Island, one ; Penobscot, Orland and Township No. 8, one ; Bucksport, one ; Mount-Desert and Eden, one ; Sullivan, Gouldsborough and Plantations numbered 7, 8, 9, 14 and 15, one :—County of Washington shall choose seven [Representatives :] District No. 1, Harrington, Steuben and Cherryfield, one ; District No. 2, Jonesborough, Columbia, Addison, Plantation No. 23, and Plantation No. 19, [one ;] District No. 3, Machias, [one ;] District No. 4, Denneysville, Plantation No. 16, Plantation No. 17, Plantation No. 15, Plantation No. 20, Plantation No. 14, Plantation No. 12, Plantation No. 9, Plantation No. 10, Plantation No. 13, Plantation No. 18, [one ;] District No. 5, Eastport, [one ;] District No. 6, Lubec and Plantation No. 11, [one ;] District No. 7, Robbinston, Perry, Calais, Houlton Plantation, New Limerick, Plantation No. 3, Plantation No. 6, Plantation No. 7, [one ;]—County of Somerset shall choose eleven Representatives : viz. Fairfield and Eastpond Settlement, one ; Norridgwock, one, for each of the years 1821, 1822, 1823 and 1824 ; Anson, one, for each of the years 1821, 1823 and 1825 ; Bloomfield, one, for each of the years 1822, 1824 and 1825 ; Starks, Mercer and Industry, one ; New Vineyard, Strong and Avon, one ; Phillips, Freeman and Kingfield, one ; New-Portland, Embden, Concord and No. 2, first Range, one ; Madison, Solon, Bingham and Moscow, one ; Canaan, Warsaw and No. 5 second Range, one ; Cornville, Athens, Harmony and Northhill, one ; Palmyra, St. Albaus, Hartland, Ripley, Parkman and Corina, one :—The County of Oxford shall choose fourteen Representatives : viz. Paris, one ; Turner, one ; Livermore, one ; Hebron, one ; Jay and Canton, one ; Sumner and Hartford, one ; Bethel, Newry and Gilead, one ; Norway and Greenwood, one ; Rumford, Woodstock, Andover and Howard's Gore, one ; Mexico, Dixfield, Weld and Peru, one ; Porter, Hiram and Brownfield, one ; Fryeburg and Denmark, one ; Waterford, Lovell and Sweden, one ; Buckfield and Albany one ; Buckfield may elect a representative four years, and then Albany one year, and so on alternately :—The County of Kennebec shall choose

twenty one Representatives: viz. Farmington, one; Leeds, one; Readfield, one; Winthrop, one; Monmouth, one; Gardiner, one; Hallowell, one; Augusta, one; Sidney, one; Waterville, one; Vassalborough, one; Temple and Wilton, to send one Representative; Temple, to send a Representative the first year, and Wilton to send a Representative the two following years, and in like manner to continue the same rotation; Green and Wayne, one; Green to send three years, and Wayne two, in rotation, Green first; Pittston and Gerry, one; Harlem and China, one; Winslow and Clinton, one; Ligonias and Freedom, one; Unity, Joy and twenty five Mile Pond Plantation, one; Fayette, Vienna and Chesterville, one; New-Sharon and Mount-Vernon, one; Belgrade, Dearborn and Rome, one:—The County of Penobscot shall choose seven Representatives: viz. Orrington, Brewer and Eddington, one; Hampden, Newburgh and Hermon, one; Bangor, Orono, Sunhaze Plantation and Plantation No. 3, one; Dixmont, Etna, Carmel, Newport, Levant, Plantation No. 3, third Range, one; Sangerville, Guilford, Foxcroft, Atkinson, Plantation No. 3, in sixth Range, one; Exeter, Corinth, New-Charleston, Garland, Dexter, one; Sebec, Williamsburgh, Brownville, Plantation No's. 1, 2 and 3, in seventh Range, Plantation No. 1. in fifth Range, one.

CHAPTER LXXVIII.

Resolve on the Pay Roll of the House of Representatives. *March 22, 1821.*
