Farmington, one; Leeds, one; Readfield, one; Winthrop, one; Monmouth, one; Gardiner, one; Hallowell, one; Augusta, one; Sidney, one; Waterville, one; Vassalborough, one; Temple and Wilton, to send one Representative; Temple, to send a Representative the first year, and Wilton to send a Representative the two following years, and in like manner to continue the same rotation; Green and Wayne, one; Green to send three years, and Wayne two, in rotation, Green first; Pittston and Gerry, one; Harlem and China, one; Winslow and Clinton, one; Ligoniam and Freedom, one; Unity, Joy and twenty five Mile Pond Plantation, one; Fayette, Vienna and Chesterville, one; New-Sharon and Mount-Vernon, one; Belgrade, Dearborn and Rome, one:—The County of Penobscot shall choose seven Representatives: viz. CHAPTER LXXVIII.

Resolve on the Pay Roll of the House of Representatives. *March 22, 1821.*

The Committee to whom was recommitted the Pay Roll of the House of Representatives, and the Resolve accompanying the same, with instructions to add one day's pay to each of the members present, have attended that service, and now *Report*, That, after deducting ten dollars from the amount set to Mr. Scammon, the member from Saco, to correct an error in the number of his days attendance, they find the amount of travel and attendance of the members the present session, to be twenty-one thousand and seventy-nine dollars; and the additional pay of the Speaker, together with the pay of the Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Messenger, Door Keeper and Page to be one thousand, fifty-three dollars and seventy-five cents; and the attendance of members one day of the last session, to be two hundred and eighteen dollars; amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty-two thousand, three hundred and fifty dollars and seventy-five cents; and Report herewith the Resolve as taken into a new draft.
