#### 102 PAY ROLL H. OF REPRESENTATIVES.—CERTIFICATE.

The Committee to whom was recommitted the Pay Roll of the House of Representatives, and the Resolve accompanying the same, with instructions to add one day's pay to each of the members present, have attended that service, and now Report, That, after deducting ten dollars from the amount set to Mr. Scammon, the member from Saco, to correct an error in the number of his days attendance, they find the amount of travel and attendance of the members the present session, to be twenty-one thousand and seventy-nine dollars; and the additional pay of the Speaker, together with the pay of the Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Messenger, Door Keeper and Page to be one thousand, fifty-three dollars and seventy-five cents; and the attendance of members one day of the last session, to be two hundred and eighteen dollars; amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty-two thousand, three hundred and fifty dollars and seventy-five cents; and Report herewith the Resolve as taken into a new draft.

EDWARD RUSSELL, per Order.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to the several persons mentioned in the preceding Roll, the several sums set against their names respectively, amounting to twenty-two thousand, three hundred and fifty dollars and seventy-five cents; and that the Governor, with advice of Council, he requested to draw his Warrant for the same accordingly.
