CHAPTER CXCVIII.

An additional Act respecting the jurisdiction and proceedings of Courts of Probate.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the estates of all persons deceased, shall be settled in the Probate Court of the county where the deceased was last an inhabitant, unless the interest of the Judge of Probate in such estates, as heir, legatee, creditor or debtor shall exceed the sum of one hundred dollars, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER CXCIX.

AN ACT to establish the salaries of the Justices of the Court of Common Pleas.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the annual sum of twelve hundred dollars shall be allowed and paid to each of the Justices of the Court of Common Pleas, out of the Treasury of the State, in equal quarterly payments.
