#### CHAPTER CCVII.

#### AN ACT, in addition to " an Act establishing and regulating the fees of the several officers and other persons therein mentioned."

**B** it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the first day of April next, it shall not be lawful for any party, or his Attorney, to tax or claim any fee for a No fee to be power, in any action commenced or to be commenced taxed for powbefore a Justice of the Peace, any thing in the act to which this is in addition to the contrary notwithstanding.

#### CHAPTER CCVIII.

# AN ACT establishing and regulating the fees of certain officers therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, the Inspector Gener-Frees of Inspector Gen al of Beef and Pork, and his respective Deputies, shall eral of Beef. be entitled to demand and receive the following fees, viz: for inspecting and branding each barrel of beef or pork, ten cents; for cutting, weighing and packing each barrel of beef or pork, eight cents; for coopering each barrel, eight cents; for inspecting and branding each half barrel of beef or pork, eight cents; for coopering the same, five cents; and for cutting, weighing and packing the same, four cents.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the Inspector  $\overline{L_{\text{Lard.}}}^{\text{Butter &}}$  of butter and lard, and his Deputies, shall be entitled to demand and receive four cents for each keg, cask or firkin, he or they may inspect and brand.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the Inspec-Amount to be tor General of beef and pork, and the Inspector of Deputies. butter and lard, shall not demand or receive from any of their respective Deputies, more than at the rate of
