#### CHAPTER LXXXVI.

AN ACT to alter the name of Phillips Limerick Academy, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Name chanRepresentatives, in Legislature assembled, That from ged to Limerand after the passing of this act, the Academy at Limerick, in the County of York, incorporated by the
name of Phillips Limerick Academy, shall be called
and known by the name of Limerick Academy.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the number Number of of Trustees of said Academy shall hereafter consist of Trustees not to exceed thiranumber not exceeding thirteen, and that seven shall teen; constitute a quorum for doing business; any thing in seven constitute act incorporating said Academy to the contrary tute a quorum notwithstanding.

#### CHAPTER LXXXVII.

AN ACT to annex the town of Harlem to the town of China.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Harlem an-Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the nexed to Chitown of Harlem, in the county of Kennebec, and the inhabitants thereof, be, and the same are hereby annexed to the town of China, in said county.

Inhabitants of Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That the inhabi-Harlem to pay tants of Harlem, who are hereby annexed to China, shall be holden to pay all taxes which have been assessed, or ordered to be assessed on them, previous to

And the Assessors, Treasurers other officers and Collectors of said Harlem, shall have the same powrelation to the er to enforce the collection of said taxes as if this act had collection of never been passed. And the town of Harlem shall continue a corporation for the sole purpose of collecting the

to adebts and taxes due to said town, and of enabling their Harlem continue creditors to collect the debts due from said town: and corporation for certain pur-shall have power to raise, assess and collect taxes for the sole purpose of paying the debts of said town.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, That said town of debts. Harlem shall be holden to pay all debts due from said town: and the same shall not be a charge upon said town of China.

Sect. 4. Be it further enacted, That the officers of Officers of Har-Iem empower the town of Harlem shall have power to do all things necessary in settling the affairs and concerns of said to town. And the property of said town, which may vest in China remain after paying its debts shall vest in the town of China.

Sect. 5. Be it further enacted, That the records, Records, &c. of Harlem, to papers and documents of said town of Harlem, shall the Clerk of be delivered over and deposited with the Clerk of China, who is said town of China, who is hereby authorized and diauthorized to certify copies, rected to keep the same and to make and certify copies thereof when required, in the same manner as of

records of the town of China, which copies shall avail to every intent and purpose, as if made and certified

by the Clerk of said town of Harlem.

Be it further enacted, That the town of to pay debts China, as it was before the passing of this Act, shall the be holden to pay all debts now due from said town, passing of this and the same shall not be a charge upon the town of Harlem; and all taxes which shall be assessed for the purpose of paying the debts now due from said China, shall be assessed upon the inhabitants living within the present bounds of China, as it was before the passing of this Act.
