CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

AN ACT to extend the time for building Rumford Bridge.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the further time of four years from the passing of this Act, be, and Time extendence is granted to the Proprietors of Rumford ed.

Bridge, to build and complete said bridge.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

AN ACT to incorporate the Officers and Members of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Maine.

Sect. 1. Re it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Charles Fox, Robert P. Dunlap, Lawrence Sprague, Erastus Persons incor-Foote, Joseph M. Gerrish, James Loring Child, Jona-porated. than Greenleaf, Gideon W. Olney, William P. Davis, with their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Officers and Members of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Maine; with power to sue and be sued; to have a common seal, and to change the same; to Powers. make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate to the value of twen-May ty thousand dollars, and any personal estate to the \$20,000, real, value of fifty thousand dollars; and give and grant, or sonal estate, bargain and sell the same; and with all the privileges &c. usually granted to other societies instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation, shall be holden at such time First meeting, and place, and be notified in such manner as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers

Act may be al-granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restrained, or tered or re-repealed, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER XC.

AN ACT to incorporate the Master, Wardens and Members of Amity Lodge.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Persons incorporated.

Wheeler, Frederick Jacobs, and Joseph W. Thorndike, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the master, wardens and members of Amity Lodge; with power to sue and be sued; to have a common seal, and to change the same; to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold for charitable and benevo-hold lent uses, any real estate, to the value of three thou-

poses of charity and beneficence.
