CHAPTER CXI.

AN ACT to incorporate the Master, Wardens and Members of the Casco Lodge.

Sect. 1. Le it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That George Persons incor-Pierce, Libbeus Bailey, Jun. John W. Mellen, Stephen porated. Chapin, Nathan Oakes, their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic by the name of the Master, Wardens and Members of Casco Lodge; with power to sue and be sued, Powers, &c. to have a common seal, and to change the same, to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate to the value of two May thousand dollars, and any personal estate to the value \$2,000 real, of five thousand dollars, and to give, grant, bargain personal esand sell the same, and with all the privileges usually tate. granted to other societies instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meet-First meeting ing of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers Act may be algranted by this Act, may be enlarged, restrained or repealed at the pleasure of the Legislature.
