north of the Waldo Patent, in the county of Somerset, and bounded northerly by township number nine, in the ninth range; easterly by number eight, in the eighth range; southerly by number seven, in the seventh range; and westerly by Bingham's Million Acres, with the inhabitants thereof, be, and hereby are incorporated into a town by the name of Monson; and the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the privileges, powers and immunities, which the inhabitants of towns within this State, do or may Powers, &co, by law enjoy.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That any Justice of the Peace within said county, is hereby empower-First meeting, ed to issue his warrant to an inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose

at their annual town meetings.
