#### CHAPTER VIII.

Resolve for making compensation to the Board of Jurisprudence.

Resolved, That there be paid to the Hon. Prentiss Mellen, William P. Preble, and Nathan Weston Jun. the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars, in full compensation for their services rendered pursuant to a Resolve of March 8th A. D. 1821; and to William B. Sewall, in full compensation for his services as Secretary to said board, the sum of three hundred dollars. And that the Governor, with the advice of Council, be authorized and requested to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the same.

### CHAPTER IX.

Resolve granting a pension to Timothy Hall, Jun.

Resolved, That the sum of four dollars per month, be paid to Timothy Hall, Jun. of Litchfield, who was a private in the militia company commanded by Captain Hugh Getchell, which was ordered out in September 1814, for the defence of the State, during the late War, and who received injury to his health while in its service. The payment to be made annually, computing from the first day of January current, and to continue during the pleasure of the Legislature, not however, to exceed the term of three years. And that the Governor, with advice of Council, be requested, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the same accordingly.
