CHAPTER XXXVIII.

Resolve respecting the Penobscot Indians.

Resolved, That, for the purpose of carrying into effect the Treaty made with the Penobscot tribe of Indians, on the seventeenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, to which treaty this State has become a party under the fifth Article of the first Section of the act of Separation, there be, and hereby is granted the sum of twelve hundred dollars to be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to purchase sundry articles of provision and clothing, which are to be furnished for the use of said tribe of Indians, in the month of October annually. And the Governor, with the advice of Council, is hereby requested to carry into full and complete effect all the terms and conditions of said Treaty on the part of this State to be performed; and for that purpose to draw his warrants on the Treasury for all or any part of said sum of twelve hundred dollars.
