CHAPTER LVII.

CHAPTER LVIII.

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to the several corporations and persons mentioned in this Roll, the sums set against such corporations and persons names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of nine thousand, three hundred ninety-nine dollars and fifty cents, the same being in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer. And the Governor, with advice of Council, is authorized and requested to draw a warrant on the Treasury for the payment of the same.
