STATE OF MAINE.

The Committee appointed by a Resolve of the Legislature passed March 22, 1822, to examine certain accounts as reported by the Joint Standing Committee on Accounts, with directions "to deduct all allowances made by the Committee on Accounts, for the support of Paupers, whose habitancy was in Massachusetts proper, prior to March 15, 1820, unless it should be made to appear, that a removal of such Paupers to that State, was impracticable," have attended to the service assigned them, and ask leave to Report, that there appears to be justly due, and ought now to be paid to the corporations hereafter mentioned the sums set to their names respectively, which when allowed and paid will be in full discharge of the said accounts, to the several dates therein mentioned, to wit;
