CHAPTER CCXV.

AN ACT to alter the times of holding the Court of Sessions in the county of Hancock.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That from and Sessions in Hanafter the passing of this Act, the times for holding the several terms of the Court of Sessions within the county of Hancock, instead of the times now designated by law, shall be, and hereby are, established, as follows, to wit: at Castine on the last Tuesday of April and No April, and on the Thursday previous to the third Tuesday of November, annually. And all matters and things returnable to, or now pending in said Court. shall be returned to, and be heard at the term of said Court, which is next to be holden on the last Tuesday of April aforesaid.

CHAPTER COXVI.

AN ACT fixing the compensation of the members of the Council, Senate, and House of Representatives.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That each member of the Council, Senate, and House of Representatives of the State of Maine, shall be allowed and paid, as compensation for his services, two dollars for each and every day he shall have attended; and two dollars for every ten miles travel from their respective places of abode, at every session; and there shall be allowed and paid to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives, two dollars each, for every day's attendance, in addition

to their pay as members; and there shall be allowed and paid to the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House of Representatives, three dollars and fifty cents each; and to their respective Assistants, three dollars each for every day they may be employed as such; and all pay rolls hereafter made up, in the cases aforesaid, shall be in conformity to the rates hereby established, and be paid out of the Treasury of the State.

CHAPTER CCXVII.

AN ACT to alter the times of holding the Court of Sessions in the County of Lincoln.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, 'That from and Sessions in Lin after the passing of this Act the times for holding the several terms of the Courts of Sessions within the county of Lincoln, instead of the times now designated by law, shall be, and hereby are established as follows, viz: at Warren on the second Tuesday of January, at Wiscasset on the second Tuesday of January⁻ May, and at Topsham on the second Tuesday of Au-^{May.} gust, annually. And all matters and things returnable to, or pending in said Court, as heretofore holden, shall be returned to, and be heard by said Court, to be held on the second Tuesday of May next.

CHAPTER CCXVIII.

AN ACT to alter the time of holding the Court of Sessions in the County of Cumberland.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in legislature assembled, That from and ^{Sessions in Cumberland, after the passing of this act, the terms of the Court of Sessions, in and for the county of Cumberland, shall be holden on the third Tuesday of April, and ^{April.}}
