SECT. 2. CHAPTER CCXXXIX.

AN additional ACT establishing and regulating the fees of certain officers therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passing of this act, the Inspector General Frees of inspector of beef and pork, and his respective deputies, shall be pork. entitled to demand and receive the following additional fees: for inspecting and branding each barrel of beef or pork, two and one half cents; for cutting, weighing and packing each barrel, two cents; for coopering each barrel, two cents; for coopering each half barrel, two cents; for cutting, weighing and packing the same, three cents; for each certificate required by law, twenty-five cents.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the Inspec- of inspector of tor of butter and lard, and his deputies, shall be en-butter and lard. titled to demand and receive for inspecting, branding and weighing each cask, keg, or firkin of butter or lard, and delivering to the owner a certificate of the same, three cents in addition to the four cents allowed in the act, to which this is additional, to be paid by the purchaser of the same ; and for each certificate required by law to be [given] twenty-five cents.
