CHAPTER CXCVI.

AN ACT to set off a part of Columbia to Harrington.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That a range of lots in the town of Columbia, in the county of Washington, included within the following bounds, to wit: beginning at the northeast corner of land belonging. to Josiah and Uriah Nash; thence a west course parallel with the town line, until it intersects the northeast corner of land belonging to Ephraim Dorman, containing five hundred acres, more or less, with the inhabitants thereof, be, and they hereby are set off from the town of Columbia aforesaid, and annexed to the town of Harrington, in said county of Washington, and shall there exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges, as inhabitants of said town of Harrington; and shall be subject to the same duties and requisitions as the other inhabitants of said town: Provided, however, The inhabitants and proprietors of said lots or tract hereby set off, shall be held to pay all assessments assessed on them, remaining unpaid prior to the passing of this act.
