CHAPTER CCXVI.

AN ACT repealing an Act to regulate the taking of Fish, called Alewives, in the town of Boothbay, in the county of Lincoln.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That an Act of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, entitled, "An Act to regulate the taking of Fish called Alewives, in the town of Boothbay, in the county of Lincoln," passed February eighteenth, eighteen hundred and two, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER CCXVII.

AN ACT to set off Peter W. Willis and others from Anson to Industry.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That lots numbered one and two, in the first range of lots of land in the town of Anson, in the county of Somerset, together with the inhabitants thereon, be, and the same hereby are set off from the said town of Anson, and annexed to the town of Industry: Provided, however, That the proprietors of said lots shall be holden to pay all assessments assessed upon them prior to the passing of this act.

CHAPTER CCXVIII.

AN ACT additional to an Act to incorporate the Kennebec Steam Navigation Company.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Seward Porter, be, and he is hereby authorized to determine the time and place for holding the first meeting of said Corporation, by giving notice thereof in one of the public papers printed in Portland, ten days at least before said meeting.*
