CHAPTER CCLV.

AN ACT additional to an act to regulate the Herring Fishery.

No nets to be set for taking herring in the waters of Washington county.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That no person whatever shall be allowed to place or set any net for the purpose of taking herrings, in any river, stream, harbor, creek or cove in the County of Washington; and any person offending against the provisions of this act, shall be liable to the same penalties as are prescribed in the act to regulate the Herring Fishery, passed March 19th, 1821: *Provided however,* That no persons setting a net for the purpose of taking herring for bait only, shall be subject to the penalties aforesaid.

CHAPTER CCLVI.

AN ACT additional to an act to prohibit certain officers of Courts from buying promissory Notes and other demands, for the purpose of making a gain or profit in the collection thereof.

Penalties for being concerned directly or indirectly in purchasing notes for gain or profit.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That if any person, with any of the intents and purposes mentioned in an Act to which this is additional, shall become liable or responsible in any manner whatever, directly or indirectly, for the payment of any sum of money or other thing, or shall become surety for another, or shall become party to any security or assurance for the payment of money, or other commodities whatever, or shall request or advise or procure another person so to become liable, or responsible, or surety, or party, as aforesaid, every person so offending, shall be liable to the pains and penalties mentioned in the act aforesaid; to be recovered and appropriated in the manner therein provided.
