CHAPTER CCLV.

AN ACT additional to an act to regulate the Herring Fishery.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That no person No nets to be whatever shall be allowed to place or set any net eet for taking for the purpose of taking herrings, in any river, stream, harbor, creek or cove in the County of Washington; and any person offending against the provisions of this act, shall be liable to the same penalties as are prescribed in the act to regulate the Herring Fishery, passed March 19th, 1821 : Provided how ever, That no persons setting a net for the purpose of taking herring for bait only, shall be subject to the penalties aforesaid.

CHAPTER CCLVI.

AN ACT additional to an act to prohibit certain officers of Courts from buying promissory Notes and other demands, for the purpose of making a gain or profit in the collection thereof.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representutives, in Legislature assembled, That if any person, with any of the intents and purposes menfor tioned in an Act to which this is additional, shall ed directly or become liable or responsible in any manner whatin ever, directly or indirectly, for the payment of any notes for gain sum of money or other thing, or shall become surety for another, or shall become party to any security or assurance for the payment of money, or other commodities whatever, or shall request or advise or procure another person so to become liable, or responsible, or surety, or party, as aforesaid, every person so offending, shall be liable to the pains and penalties metioned in the act aforesaid; to be recovered and appropriated in the manner therein provided.
