CHAPTER CCLXIII.

AN ACT additional to the Act for the Inspection of Butter and Lard.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Repeal of part so much of the fifth section of an act passed on the nineteenth day of March, eighteen hundred twenty one, entitled "An act to ascertain the quality of butter and hogs lard, and for the more effectual inspection of the same," as relates to butter exported, or intended to be exported from this State to any of the United States, east of New York, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Inspection not required in certain cases.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That so much of the third section of the same act as relates to the description of the wood, or the size of the casks, kegs or firkins in which butter shall be packed for exportation to any of said States east of New York, be, and the same is hereby repealed: Provided, however, That in case any purchaser may wish to have butter inspected, this act shall not be so construed as to prevent such inspection.

CHAPTER CCLXIV.

AN ACT altering the time of holding the Court of Sessions in the county of Washington.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, the Court of Sessions shall be holden within and for the county of Washington, at Machias, on the second Tuesday of March, and on the fourth Tuesday of September, annually, instead of the times heretofore established by law; and all matters and things now pending in said Court, or returnable thereto at the next term thereof, to be holden on the first Tuesday of March next, shall be returned to, have day and be acted

Sessions at Machias, March and September. upon, in said Court, at the next term to be holden pursuant to this act, on the second Tuesday of March next.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That no term of to be holden when, ac. S.J. said Court of Sessions shall hereafter be holden in C. or C. C.P. said county by adjournment at any time or place are in session. when or where the Supreme Judicial Court, or Court of Common Pleas shall or may be in session, at a regular term thereof.

This Act passed February 17, 1824.]

CHAPTER CCLXV.

AN ACT fixing the times of holding the Court of Common Pleas in the county of Cumberland.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from Com. Pleas, and after the passing of this act, the Court of Com- March, June mon Pleas shall be held annually at Portland, within and October. and for the county of Cumberland, on the first Tuesday of March, the third Tuesday of June, and the first Tuesday of October, instead of the times prescribed in the act passed February 11, 1823. [This Act passed February 17, 1824.]

CHAPTER CCLXVI.

AN ACT respecting Public Shows and Exhibitions.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, no person Exhibitions, shall presume to exhibit any images, pageantry, Shows, &c. not to be made slight-of-hand tricks, pupper show or circus, within withoutlicense any town or plantation in this State, for money, from Selection, without having first obtained a license or permit therefor, in writing, from the Selectmen of the town or Assessors of the plantation in which such exhi-
