SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That two undivided third parts of all lands reserved for the use of the ministry or for the use of the first settled ministry & schools. ^{Reservation for use ministry & schools.} or for the use of schools in said Plantation No. 6, shall belong to the said town of Berlin, for the uses to which they were granted or reserved.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That Ichabod Foster, Esq. a Justice of the Peace in the County of Oxford, or any other Justice of the Peace in said County, be, and he hereby is authorized to ^{First meeting.} call the first meeting of said inhabitants, by issuing his warrant to some one of said inhabitants, directing him to notify them to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual meetings.

CHAPTER CCXXXIV.

AN ACT additional to the "Act establishing a ministerial and school fund in Greene."

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Jairus Phillips, whose name was by mistake inserted in the Act to which this is additional as James Phillips, be and he is declared to be one of the trustees, incorporated by said act: and all acts and doings of the said Jairus Phillips, as trustee aforesaid, be, and they are hereby confirmed and made valid in law, notwithstanding the mistake aforesaid. ^{Name corrected of Jairus Phillips.} ^{Confirmation of former doings.}

CHAPTER CCXXXV.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Kilmarnock.
