PORTLAND:

May take and thousand dollars, and any personal estate, to the value of ten thousand dollars, and to give and grant or bargain and sell the same; and with all the privileges usually granted to other societies, instituted for the purposes of charity and beneficence.

First meeting.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be held at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

Restrictions.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or repealed, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

This Act passed February 9, 1824.

CHAPTER CCLIX.

AN ACT additional to the Act authorizing a Lottery for the benefit of the Cumberland and Oxford Canal Corporation.

Managers alper cent. on by wholesale.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That in Managers all lowed to make addition to the powers and privileges granted in deduction of 2 and by "An Act authorizing a Lottery for the benrickets sold efit of the Cumberland and Oxford Canal Corporation," passed February 11, 1823, it shall and may be lawful for the managers of said Lottery to deduct from the amount of each ticket sold, two per cent, when sold by the managers to any person or persons for the purpose of being sold again; and said managers shall be allowed to make such deduction in charging themselves with the amount received for tickets sold, in the book which they are required to keep, by the act aforesaid.
