CHAPTER CCLXVI.

AN ACT to set off Jonathan Powers and others from Palmyra to Warsaw.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Jonathan Powers, Joseph Noble, Josiah Hodges and Benjamin Hodges, with their polls and estates, within the town of Palmyra, in the county of Somerset, be, and they hereby are set off from said town of Palmyra and annexed to the town of Warsaw, in said county of Somerset: Provided, That the persons, set off as aforesaid, shall be held to pay all taxes assessed against them in said Palmyra prior to the passing of this act, and to continue classed as they now are for the choice of all public officers until a new classification is by law established.

CHAPTER CCLXVII.

AN ACT to incorporate the Master, Wardens and Members of Freeport Lodge.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Robert R. Kendall, Joseph Dennison, Joel Kelsey, Joseph Lufkin and Samuel Dillingham, junior, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a body politic, by the name and style of the "Master, Wardens and Members of Freeport Lodge;" with power to sue and be sued; to have a common seal, and change the same; to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State, nor to ancient masonic usages; to take and hold, for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate, to the value of three thousand dollars, and any personal estate, to the value of five thousand dollars, and to give and grant or bargain and sell the same; and with all the privileges usually granted to other societies, instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.
