CHAPTER CCLXXII.

AN ACT establishing the line between Litchfield and Richmond.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, the dividing line between the towns of Litchfield and Richmond, in the county of Lincoln, shall pass and be extended through the middle of the Cobbisse Contee stream instead of any other line or boundary heretofore established as the dividing line between the said towns.

CHAPTER CCLXXIII.

AN ACT to change the name of Warsaw.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, the name of the town of Warsaw, in the county of Somerset, shall cease, and the said town shall henceforth be called and known by the name of Pittsfield; any law to the contrary notwithstanding; and nothing in this act contained shall be construed to impair any rights of said corporation.

CHAPTER CCLXXIV.

AN ACT additional to an Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Ministerial fund in the North Parish in Berwick.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees of the Ministerial Fund in the North part of Berwick, incorporated by the act to which this is additional, to hold their annual meeting either in March or April, as may be by said Trustees deemed most expedient, any thing in the Act to which this is additional to the contrary notwithstanding.
