#### NAMES CHANGED.

### CHAPTER CCLXXXIV.

#### AN ACT to change the names of sundry persons.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Jacob Quincy, jun. of Portland, in the county of Cumberland, shall be allowed to take the name of William Jacob Quincy; that John Myrick, Barnabas Palmer Myrick, David Copp Myrick, and John Palmer Myrick, of Warsaw, in the county of Somerset, together with their children, shall be allowed to take the surname of Merrick; that Louis Osgood, of Fryburg, in the county of Oxford, shall be allowed to take the name of Edward Lewis Osgood ; that John Perkins the fourth, of Kennebunk-Port, in the county of York, shall be allowed to take the name of John G. Perkins; that Simon Remick, of Fryburg, in the county of Oxford, shall be allowed to take the name of Franklin Simon Remick ; that William Spraul, 3d. of Bristol, in the county of Lincoln, shall be allowed to take the name of William Henry Spraul; that Joseph Paine, 3d. of Standish, in the county of Cumberland, shall be allowed to take the name of Joseph Wallace Paine; that Charles Gooding, of Portland aforesaid, shall be allowed to take the name of George Charles Gooding; that Manassah Rogers, of the same Portland, shall be allowed to take the name of Charles M. Rogers; that George Ramsdell, of York, in the county of York, shall be allowed to take the name of George Littlefield; and that Zachariah Brackett, of Westbrook, in the county of Cumberland, shall be allowed to take the name of Zachariah Bangs Brackett. And said persons shall in future be respectively known and called by the names which they are respectively allowed to take as aforesaid; and the same shall be considered as their only proper names.
