CHAPTER CCLXXXV.

AN ACT in further addition to an Act concerning foreign attachment.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of the first section of an act, entitled "An additional act concerning foreign attachment," passed February the twenty-fourth, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, as requires the Plaintiff and supposed Trustee both to reside in the same county where the Justice has jurisdiction, be, and the same is hereby repealed.*

Part of former act repealed.

CHAPTER CCLXXXVI.

AN ACT relating to the Duties on Commissions.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, whenever any person shall be appointed to any civil office, upon which a duty is now, or hereafter may be required to be paid for the use of the State, no commission shall be made out until said duty has been paid. And it shall be the duty of the Secretary of State forthwith to notify such person of his appointment; and upon such person's producing from the proper officer a receipt for the amount of the duty required, a commission shall forthwith be made out and delivered to him, or any other person applying therefor by his authority.*

Commission not to be made out until the duty is paid.

Secretary of State to give notice of appointment, &c.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted, That the Secretary of State shall, on the first day of January annually, certify to the Treasurer of the State the amount paid to the several Treasurers of counties, towns and plantations, for duties on commissions by him delivered, the year preceding.*

To certify amount paid, annually.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted, That all acts, or parts of acts, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same are hereby repealed.*

Repealing clause.
