#### CHAPTER CCCII.

AN ACT to change the time of holding the Supreme Judicial Court in the County of Cumberland.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the time of holding the Supreme Judicial Court, in and for the county of Cumberland, shall be on the S. J. C. in and second Tuesday of May annually, and not on the of the county first Tuesday of May, as heretofore holden. #### CHAPTER CCCIII.

AN ACT in addition to "an Act providing for payment of costs in criminal prosecutions."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Courts of Sessions of the several counties, be, and hereby are authorized to examine and allow such bills of costs as have arisen, or may hereafter Gourts of Ses- arise, in criminal prosecutions, before any Justice of sions to exa-mine & allow the Peace, for fees allowed by law to be taxed for bills of costs Justices of the Peace, officers and witnesses, where tices of the person accused is convicted; and also for fees of officers and witnesses, where the person accused is acquitted by such Justice, to be paid out of their

county Treasury, at the charge of the county:
