#### CHAPTER XLVIII.

Resolve relating to Burnt Island.

Resolved, That the Land Agent of this State, be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to release by deed, to William Parsons, Jun. or his assigns, all the right, title and interest, which this State hath, or is supposed to have, in the island lying southerly of the town of St. George, called Burnt Island, he or they paying to said Agent a reasonable compensation for all the trouble and expense of making and executing such release.

### CHAPTER XLIX.

Resolve laying a Tax on the several Counties in this State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several Counties, contained in the following schedule, be, and the same are hereby granted, as a tax for each County respectively; to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same:

YORK, Seven thousand dollars.

CUMBERLAND, Ten thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight dls.

Lincoln, Six thousand and seven hundred dollars. Four thousand and eight hundred dollars.

Hancock, Four thousand dollars.

Washington, Four thousand and three hundred dollars.

Oxford, Four thousand dollars.

Somerset, Two thousand dollars.

Penonscor, Two thousand seven hundred and twenty dollars.
