they hereby are incorporated into a body politic, by the name of The Morning Star Lodge; with power to prosecute and defend suits at law; <sup>Powers, &c.</sup> to have a common seal, which they may change at pleasure; to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take and hold, for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate, <sup>May hold estate, &c.</sup> to the value of three thousand dollars, and any personal estate to the value of five thousand dollars, and to give and grant, or bargain and sell the same; and with all the powers and privileges usually granted to other societies, instituted for similar purposes.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said corporation shall be held at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, <sup>First meeting.</sup> as a majority of the persons named herein may direct.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act, may be enlarged, <sup>Powers restricted</sup> restricted, or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.

### CHAPTER CCCLXIII.

AN ACT to change the name of the town of Joy.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That from and after the passage of this Act, the town of Joy, in the County of Kennebec, shall be <sup>Name changed.</sup> known and called by the name of Montgomery; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
