hereby are authorized and empowered, for the more convenient support and management of their schools, to unite in the erection of a school house, at such place, in either of said Districts, as the inhabitants of both said Districts may School house to agree upon. And said school house, so erected or occupied, may be used and maintained in common, by the inhabitants of said Districts, for their common benefit, so long as they shall agree thereto; and the inhabitants aforesaid, shall have all the powers and privileges, incident by law to School Districts.

Be it further enacted, That the Monies how ap monies raised, assessed and collected in each of plied. said Districts, shall be applied to the support of a school in one place, for the common use and benefit of the inhabitants of both said Districts. so long as they shall agree thereto.

#### CHAPTER CCCLXXXV.

AN ACT in addition to "An Act to establish the Cony Female Academy."

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Legislature of this State shall have the right to grant any further powers, to alter, limit or restrain any of the powers vested in the Trustees of the Cony Female Academy, by the Act to which this is in addition, as shall be judged necessary to promote the best interests of said institution, the said Trustees having assented thereto. [Approved by the Governor, Feb. 8, 1826.]

Powers, &c. granted by former act may be altered, &c.
