#### CHAPTER CCCLXXXVI.

AN ACT to set off Washington Remick from Kittery to Elliot.

BE it enacted by the Senute and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled. That Washington Remick, with his polls, and the estate which he owns or occupies, in the town of Estate set off; Kittery, in the County of York, be, and hereby is, set off from said town of Kittery, and annexed to the town of Elliot, in the same County: Provided however, That said Remick shall be Proviso. held to pay all taxes assessed upon him in said town of Kittery, previous to the passing of this Act.

#### CHAPTER CCCLXXXVII.

## AN ACT dividing the town of Baldwin, and incorporating the #town of Sebago.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the town of Baldwin, in the County of Cumberland, be divided, and that all that part windivided; and of said town lying northwardly and eastwardly rated. of the following described line, viz. : beginning at the mouth of Northwest river; thence up said river one hundred and sixty rods, to the northeast corner of lot number twenty-one, in the first eastern range; thence south sixty-five degrees west, to the northwest corner of said lot; thence north twenty-five degrees west, three hundred Boundaries. rods, to the northeast corner of lot number eighteen, in the second range; thence south, sixty-five degrees west, one hundred and sixty rods, to the northwest corner of said lot; thence north twenty-five degrees west, two hundred rods, to the northeast corner of lot numbered sixteen, in the third range; thence south sixty-five degrees west, one hundred and sixty rods, to the northwest corner of said lot; thence north twenty-five de-
