CHAPTER CCCCII.

AN ACT in addition to "An Act to incorporate the North Yarmouth Academy."

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Legislature of this State, shall have the right Legislature may to grant any further powers to, alter, limit or restrain any of the powers vested in, the Trustees of North Yarmouth Academy, by the Act to which this is in addition, as shall be judged necessary to promote the best interests of said institution; the Trustees of said Academy having assented hereto.
