CHAPTER III.

Resolve in favor of Heman Nye.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Heman Nye, as a pension, in consequence of an injury sustained by him, by means of a wound received, while on duty in the Militia, the sum of three dollars per month ; to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, and to continue until the further order of the Legislature.

[*Approved by the Governor, January 26, 1826.*]

CHAPTER IV.

Resolve granting a pension to Elisha Douglass.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Elisha Douglass, of Monroe, three dollars per month, annually, for the term of three years, commencing on the twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six ; as a pension, in consequence of a wound received in a skirmish with the British troops, on the Penobscot, in the late war : *Provided however*, That said Pension shall cease on the death of said Douglass, within the time aforesaid.

CHAPTER V.

Resolve granting a pension to David Sevey.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to David Sevey, of Machias, three dollars per month, annually, for the term of three years, if he shall so long live, to commence on the seventeenth day of March next, as a pension, in consequence of a wound, received in the late war, while performing duty in the Machias Artillery.
