CHAPTER XXII.

Resolve in favor of William Tozier.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to William Tozier, as a further compensation for a wound received by him, while on duty in the Militia, the sum of forty eight dollars.

[*Approved by the Governor, February 18, 1826.*]

CHAPTER XXIII.

Resolve in favor of Valentine Cook.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Valentine Cook, three dollars per month, during his natural life, to commence on the first day of February instant ; in consequence of a wound received while on military duty, as a soldier in the Militia of this State.
