CHAPTER XLVI.

Resolve making an appropriation for the purchase of certain articles for the use of the Militia.

Resolved, That the unexpended balance of an appropriation for the purchase of Brass Field Ordnance, under the Resolve of February twenty third, eighteen hundred and twenty five, be, and the same hereby is, appropriated and allowed to be expended by the Adjutant General, under the direction of the Governor and Council, for the purchase of such musical instruments, colours and supplies for the Militia, as may be required for the use of the Militia of this State.

CHAPTER XLVII.

Resolve relating to the Kennebec road.

Resolved, That the Governor, with the advice of Council, be, and he hereby is, authorized to appoint some suitable person, as Agent in behalf of the State, for the purpose of causing to be cleared, and made passable, the road called the Kennebec road, north of the Million Acres, in the county of Somerset, so far as the same extends through the public lands; and the said Agent is hereby authorized, for the purpose aforesaid,
