any logs, or other timber which may be in the Moosehead lake or in said east branch, or that may be run down said east branch. *And provided also*, That no person or persons, who shall drive his or their logs, masts or spars in said waters, in such manner as not to intermix them with other logs, so that they cannot be conveniently separated, shall be subject to the provisions of this Act.

### CHAPTER CCCLVI.

AN ACT ADDITIONAL to An Act establishing the times of holding the Supremo Judicial Court within this State.

Term altered in Hancock.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That the time of holding the Supremo Judicial Court, in and for the County of Hancock, shall be on the third Tuesday of October, annually, and not on the fourth Tuesday of October, as heretofore holden.

Additional term in Penobscot.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That in addition to the terms of the Supremo Judicial Court, by law established, a term of said Court shall be holden annually, by one or more of the Justices thereof, at Bangor, in and for the county of Penobscot, on the fourth Tuesday of October annually.

### CHAPTER CCCLVII.

AN ACT respecting Toll Bridges.

Penalty for injuring bridge or gate or attempting to pass without paying toll.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That if any person shall maliciously break down, or otherwise injure or destroy the toll
