CHAPTER CCCLXV.

AN ACT respecting Gun Houses.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That whenever any or either of the Gun Houses, used Whenever Gun unserviceable, to for the protection and preservation of guns, gun carriages, tumbrils, munitions of war, or any other apparatus, provided for the use of the Artillery of this State, shall be so far injured or decayed, as that, in the opinion of the Commanding Officer of any Division of the Militia, in which said gun houses are situated, it is inexpedient to repair the same, such Commanding Officer may authorize the Captain of the Artillery Company having the immediate superintendence of the gun house, thus injured or decayed, to dispose of the same, either at public or private sale, as he may judge most advantageous, and deposit the proceeds thereof in the Treasury of the State, for the use thereof.

CHAPTER CCCLXVI.

AN ACT fixing the place of the permanent Seat of Government, and prescribing where the Legislature shall hold its Sessions.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assem-Seat of Govern-bled, That on and after the first day of January, gusta after Janu- which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, the permanent Seat of Government shall be established at Augusta, in the county of Kennebec.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That until said first day of January, eighteen hundred and Legislature to meet at Portland thirty-two, the Legislature will annually assemulations until that time. ble and hold its session at Portland, in the coun-

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the Governor and Council, be authorized to obtain a conceptor of a suitable lot of land in conveyance of a said Augusta, on which the Public Buildings lie Buildings. may be erected, provided the same can be had without expense to the State.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That the sum of five hundred dollars be appropriated and Appropriation for certain purplaced at the disposal of the Governor, to enable him to cause such lot as may be conveyed to the State, to be improved, fenced and ornamented with forest trees, as the Governor and

Council may direct.

SECT. 5. Be it further enacted, That all laws Repeal of other and resolves inconsistent with the provisions of laws, &c. this Act, be, and the same are hereby repealed. [Approved by the Governor, Feb. 24, 1827.]

CHAPTER CCCLXVII.

AN ACT establishing Circuit Courts Martial.

Sect. 1.
