CHAPTER CCCCXXXVII.

AN ACT to set off Isaiah Jenkins and others from Litchfield to Wales.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of . موجع Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Isaiah Jenkins, James Taylor, John Arno, Da-Persons and exvid Jenkins, David Mitchell, Bartholomew Jenkins, Henry Austin, William Larrabee, John Austin, Thomas Meeder, George Meeder, Alfred Arno, Isaiah Jenkins, Jr. together with their polls and estates now included in the range of lots beginning at Monmouth south line and running on the original line of said lots until it intersects Lisbon north line, as well as all other persons and their polls and estates which are now included within the range of lots aforesaid, be and the same hereby are set off from the town of Litchfield, and annexed to the town of Wales, in the county of Lincoln: and shall there exercise and enjoy all rights and privileges as inhabitants of said town of Wales: Provided however, That the persons above set off shall be held liable to Provisor pay all assessments upon them or their estates, remaining unpaid prior to the passing of this Act, and their proportion of all debts which may be now due from said town of Litchfield; and in

case any person or persons now residing upon or who have herotofore resided upon and have gained a settlement in the range of lots hereby set off from said town of Litchfield, and annexed to Wales, shall become chargeable as town paupers, the expenses and liabilities in consequence thereof shall be borne by said town of Wales.

CHAPTER CCCCXXXVIII.

AN ACT to incorporate the Cherryfield Log Driving Company.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assem-Persons incorpobled, That Thompson Lewis, Tobias A. Hall, James Small, and Robert Foster, Jun'r. with their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Cherryfield Log Driving Company, for the more convenient navigating or the purpose of transporting and transporting of Logs on the first and transporting guages river, in gus, so far as the same passes through the town therefold. and transporting of Logs on the river Narraguaof Cherryfield; and by that name to have power to prosecute and defend suits at law; to have and use a common seal; to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; and to have all other powers and privileges, incident or usually granted to corporate bodies for the convenient management of their affairs.

> SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That any person or persons who now are or may hereafter become owners of logs, intended to be transported or rafted on the river aforesaid, may become members or associates of the corporation aforesaid, on making application thereto, and contributing their just proportion of the expenses incident to the management of the affairs of said corporation: Provided however, That this Act, or any provisions thereof, shall not be so con-
