CHAPTER CCCCLXIX.

AN ACT additional to "An Act to establish the Damariscotta Canal."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assem-Act of incorporabled, That if the said Canal Corporation shall unless the Canal not complete said Canal within six years from he completed within six years, the passage of this Act, then the Act to which this is additional shall be void.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the act repealed. The section of the Act to which this is additional, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER CCCCLXX.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of Edgecomb Bridge.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Stephen Parsons, William M. Boyd, James Drummond, William M. Read, Aaron, Blaney, John McKown, Abiel Wood, Moses Shaw, Moses Davis, and Rufus Sewall, their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Proprietors of Edgecomb Bridge, for the purpose of building a bridge across Sheepscot river from Davis's Island in Edgecomb to some suitable point in Wiscasset, northwardly of Union Wharf; with power to prosecute and defend suits at law; to have and use a common seal; to make any by-laws for the convenient management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to make such contracts and purchases as may be necessary for
